Canvas

This year we will be utilizing Canvas, which is a learning management system website, for our at-home learning days. It is password protected. Your child will be trained how to login and how to navigate our class Canvas page for their assignments.

Outdoor Learning

I intend to utilize our school's outdoor learning spaces as much as possible this year for lessons, community circles, and science investigations. That being said, please plan accordingly and send your child to school with appropriate clothing and layers for time spent outdoors.

Homework

In lieu of a weekly homework packet I have decided to forego homework this year as students will be working on at-home learning assignments a few days each week. Take-Home Folders

We will be organizing our work and important papers with our Take-Home folders. It will be expected that our folders be taken home and brought back to school for each in-person school day. Students will bring home completed and graded work in these folders, as well as important announcements and fliers. We will do our very best to keep our school materials organized and clean.

Snacks & Water Bottles
